About Us

In 1967 a handful of local enthusiasts had a vision: to start a museum celebrating Pickering's rich heritage. Beck Isle Museum was born. Housed in a handsome stone Regency period Grade 2* listed building and located close to the centre of the market town of Pickering, it is a popular gateway to the North Yorkshire Moors National Park.

Extensive work was required to combat deterioration to the fabric of the buildings and to upgrade the interior. Slowly, more galleries were opened and, in more recent years, an education room and collections store was built. The museum now comprises a total of 27 separate rooms, galleries and display areas. Our collections include social and agricultural history, photographs and costume and tell a rich story of the area and its industrial, social and cultural development. History is brought to life in areas such as our grocers, barbers and blacksmith's forge.

The museum was founded on the enthusiasm of volunteers who transformed their vision into reality. We are looking for Trustees with the same ambitious spirit, who are prepared to work as part of a team to shape the future of Beck Isle Museum.

Being a Trustee

Our Trustee Board is made up of people whose skills and experience help us to deliver our vision for the museum: to inspire the local community and audiences to discover, engage with and care for the cultural heritage of Pickering and the surrounding area.

Trustees are the museum's greatest advocates and they work closely with staff and volunteers. Their main duties are:

The Board of Trustees meets six times a year. Sub-committees may meet more frequently.

We anticipate that your Trustee duties would take one or two days per month, inclusive of the bi-monthly board meetings, but you are welcome to commit more time to the museum's work.

Trustees are appointed for a term of three years, which may be renewed.
